



Climate scientists and experts declare "there is no climate emergency"

Over 1,600 experts, including Nobel laureates, signed a declaration that calls for an end to exaggerations and scaremongering over climate and a return to solid scientific and policy analysis.

The declaration is timely and important. The media daily parrots unscientific claims made by climate pressure groups that falsely attributes natural weather to global warming. They are pushing ruinous energy plans which will devastate our natural world and wreck our energy grid at the same time.

The declaration states:

Climate science should be less political, while climate policies should be more scientific. In particular, scientists should emphasize that their modeling output is not the result of magic: computer models are human-made. What comes out is fully dependent on what theoreticians and programmers have put in...

To believe the outcome of a climate model is to believe what the model makers have put in. This is precisely the problem of today's climate discussion to which climate models are central. Climate science has degenerated into a discussion based on beliefs, not on sound self-critical science. We should free ourselves from the naïve belief in immature climate models. In future, climate research must give significantly more emphasis to empirical science.

These are the headings for the main points:

- Natural as well as anthropogenic factors cause warming
- Warming is far slower than predicted
- Climate policy relies on inadequate models
- CO₂ is plant food, the basis of all life on Earth
- Global warming has not increased natural disasters
- Climate policy must respect scientific and economic realities

The declaration concludes:

There is no climate emergency. Therefore, there is no cause for panic and alarm. We strongly oppose the harmful and unrealistic net-zero CO₂ policy proposed for 2050. If better approaches emerge, and they certainly will, we have ample time to reflect and re-adapt. The aim of global policy should be 'prosperity for all' by providing reliable and affordable energy at all times. In a prosperous society men and women are well educated, birthrates are low and

people care about their environment.

Bravo to CLINTEL and the many brave scientists and experts who mustered the courage to speak facts to power. They all know full well that the massively well-funded Climate propaganda machine will immediately launch a campaign to ridicule and attack them.

Science needs heroes. Nice to see some step up to the plate.
